**Name of Form:** **Petition and Stipulation to Waive Appearance and Hearing, and Order Extending Probation/Judgment for Restitution/Judgment for Court Ordered Financial Obligations**

**Purpose of Form:** To extend the probation period for an individual placed on probation to the Department of Corrections or, alternatively, to enter a judgment for unpaid restitution against the defendant and in favor of the person owed the restitution and/or enter a judgment for unpaid court obligations.

**Who Completes It:** The Division of Community Corrections, Department of Corrections, would complete the form and submit it to the court for signing by the judge.

**Distribution of Form:** *If the court is extending probation*, the original is filed in the criminal case file. Since the Department of Corrections and the probationer will already have copies, additional copies would not normally be required to be sent.

*If the court is granting judgment for unpaid restitution or unpaid financial obligations*, the original is filed in the criminal case file. The Clerk is required to docket the judgment without fee. Notice of entry of judgment must be sent to the judgment creditor and debtor as with any civil judgment.

**Accompanying Forms:** Generally none.

**New Form/Modification:** Modification, last update 11/99.

**Modifications:** Added in court order, "Twelve percent (12%) interest will be added from the date of entry of judgment."
